The school's panels are part of the first phase of a countywide solar-energy program. A total of 36 public-sector locations are having solar panels installed in 2011 as part of the taxpayer-neutral initiative. In addition to the High School, Montgomery Middle School, Orchard Hill Elementary School and carport, and the Otto Kaufman Community Center also are part of Phase 1.

The average annual cost savings on the electricity generated by the solar projects is estimated at 60 percent, depending on the roof size and other factors. Vanguard will own, operate and maintain the solar arrays for 15 years, selling the renewable electricity to the county at predictable, discounted rates.
